Why Cheatham County?



Cheatham County is filled with a growing teen population, making it an ideal place for youth to connect, grow, and thrive. More importantly, it is a place where the future is being shaped every day—by the hands and hearts of its young people. In a community with such a solid foundation, Rocketown stands ready to be the hub where teens in Cheatham County can truly shine.

Because the community of Cheatham County cares so deeply about its young people, concerns have been raised about the troubling rise in drug and alcohol use among youth —a clear signal that alternatives are needed. A significant portion of the young population lack access to positive, structured activities, which can lead them down dangerous paths.





Rocketown offers a proven solution to this challenge. For over three decades, Rocketown has been a pillar for teens, providing a safe space where they can explore their interests, build positive relationships, and develop crucial life skills. This facility will not only serve as a refuge from the negative influences of drugs and alcohol but also as a hub of creativity, learning, and spiritual growth.

Response to Concern

Local surveys and community meetings frequently highlight substance abuse as a top concern for residents, particularly the impact on youth and the need for more preventative programs.

Opioid Crisis Impact

Tennessee has one of the highest opioid prescription rates in the country. Cheatham County has been significantly impacted by the opioid crisis, with prescription rates historically higher than the national average. The high prescription rate has contributed to a significant number of opioid-related overdose deaths in Cheatham County. The county's overdose death rate is approximately 29.5 per 100,000 people, compared to the national rate of about 21.6 per 100,000 people.

Youth & Substance and Alcohol Abuse

Surveys have indicated that a significant number of teens in Cheatham County report have used drugs, particularly marijuana and prescription drugs. The Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services reports that about 15% of high school students in rural Tennessee communities, including Cheatham County, have used prescription drugs without a doctor's prescription.

The number of drug-related arrests in Cheatham County has been rising, particularly for offenses related to methamphetamine, opioids, and marijuana. These arrests often involve young adults, <u>underscoring the need</u> for preventative programs.

Mission



The Approach


